

ADVENT

WALK WITH ME: Our watchwords for Advent are: Watching, Waiting, Hearing, Hoping, Seeing and Believing. They are repeated time and again in our prayers and hymns for this season, as well as in the beautiful prophecies of the Old Testament. These words reach their climax in the response of Mary who pondered and treasured these things, storing them up in her heart. The Christian life teaches that no time is wasted when we serve God; our service of God is the sanctification of time.

The **Walk with Me** meditations offer us the time and space to do these things. Why not sit quietly with *Walk with Me* for a few minutes each day?

THE ADVENT TWIG

Throughout Advent the familiar SVP "Twig" appears at the back of church, hung with labels. Each label carries a request for a Christmas present. Most of these are for some Christmas treats for hard-up families in Monmouth.
